

or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of Harehills Cemetery, and extending thence first south-eastward and thence south-westward along the walls or fences forming the eastern and southern boundaries of Harehills Cemetery for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the houses and premises situate on the western side of Brander Drive, and extending thence southward to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and generally southward along the walls or fences forming the northern and western boundaries of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of Brander Drive and on the western side of Brander Approach for a distance in all of 21 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the northern side of Gipton Approach, and extending thence first south-eastward to and thence south-westward along the middle of Gipton Approach for a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with York Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Agnes, Burmantofts, from the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Osmondthorpe."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of his said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of July 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the unions of (1) the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Sandhutton with the Benefice of Gate Helmsley with Upper Helmsley (now part of the United Benefice of Gate and Upper Helmsley with Holtby and Warthill) and (2) the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Stockton on the Forest with the Benefice of Holtby with Warthill (now part of the said United Benefice of Gate and Upper Helmsley with Holtby and

Warthill) all of which Benefices are situate in the County and Diocese of York:

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 21st day of December, 1920, and published in the London Gazette on the 24th day of the same month provision was made for the union of the said Benefices of Gate Helmsley with Upper Helmsley and Holtby with Warthill, and such union has since taken effect:

"And whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to enquire into and report upon the re-arrangement of the said Benefices of Sandhutton, Gate and Upper Helmsley with Holtby and Warthill, and Stockton on the Forest duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of York and therein recommended the unions of (1) the said Benefices of Sandhutton and Gate Helmsley with Upper Helmsley and (2) the said Benefices of Stockton on the Forest and Holtby with Warthill and the terms for effecting the same and the said Archbishop of York signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Sandhutton and Stockton on the Forest are now full, the Reverend Reginald Trevor Hughes being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sandhutton and the Reverend John Hargreaves Ashworth Cobham being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stockton on the Forest, and the said Benefice of Gate and Upper Helmsley with Holtby and Warthill is at present vacant:

"And whereas the patronage of the said United Benefice of Gate and Upper Helmsley with Holtby and Warthill as to one alternate turn or right of presentation is vested in Your Majesty Your Heirs and Successors and is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of England for the time being and as to the other alternate turn or right of presentation is vested in the said Archbishop of York and his successors:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said William, Archbishop of York, of the said Reginald Trevor Hughes and of the said John Hargreaves Ashworth Cobham (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:

"1. That the said Benefice of Sandhutton and that part of the said United Benefice of Gate and Upper Helmsley with Holtby and Warthill which consists of the said Benefice of Gate Helmsley with Upper Helmsley shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Sandhutton with Gate and Upper Helmsley' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That the said Benefice of Stockton on the Forest and that part of the said United Benefice of Gate and Upper Helmsley with
