

Holtby and Warthill which consists of the said Benefice of Holtby with Warthill shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stockton on the Forest with Holtby and Warthill', but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said unions shall forthwith take effect; and the said Reginald Trevor Hughes, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sandhutton, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Sandhutton with Gate and Upper Helmsley and the said John Hargreaves Ashworth Cobham, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stockton on the Forest, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Stockton on the Forest with Holtby and Warthill.

" 4. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Sandhutton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Sandhutton with Gate and Upper Helmsley and (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stockton on the Forest shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Stockton on the Forest with Holtby and Warthill.

" 5. That, subject to the provisions of Clause 6 of this Scheme, upon the said unions taking effect (a) there shall be annexed or appropriated to the said United Benefice of Sandhutton with Gate and Upper Helmsley a part of the endowments now belonging to the said United Benefice of Gate and Upper Helmsley with Holtby and Warthill, that is to say, (i) all the glebe lands now belonging to the said United Benefice and situate in the Parishes of Haxby and Gate Helmsley, at East Cottingwith in the Parish of Cottingwith and at High Dunsforth in the Parish of Dunsforth, all in the County of York and (ii) a part, that is to say, a sum of £4,744 8s. 11d. part of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty to the said United Benefice pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act and (iii) the following several sums of stock now held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners on behalf of the said United Benefice, that is to say, the sums of £2,000 Local Loans £3 per cent. Stock, £592 18s. 3d. £3½ per cent. Conversion Stock, £674 5s. 6d. £3 per cent. Redemption Stock (1986-96), £690 4s. 7d. £3 per cent. Redemption Stock (1986-96), £612 5s. 7d. £3½ per cent. Conversion Stock, £1,015 4s. 6d. India £3 per cent. Stock and £2,000 Local Loans £3 per cent. Stock, and the three sums of Stock firstly hereinbefore referred to shall be held discharged from any of the trusts imposed by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 27th day of February, 1930, and published in the London Gazette on the 4th day of March in the same year for constituting certain Stock (new represented by the three

sums of Stock aforesaid) as a fund the income whereof shall be applicable towards the payment of the expenses of providing assistance by Clergy or lay workers for the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Gate and Upper Helmsley with Holtby and Warthill; and (b) there shall be annexed or appropriated to the said United Benefice of Stockton on the Forest with Holtby and Warthill all the other endowments now belonging to the said United Benefice of Gate and Upper Helmsley with Holtby and Warthill including (i) all the remainder of the Glebe lands (excluding all such Glebe lands mentioned in paragraph (a) of this Clause) now belonging to the said United Benefice and situate in the Parish of Warthill in the County of York and (ii) the Parsonage House situate in the said Parish of Warthill at present belonging to the said United Benefice and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith and (iii) the remainder of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by the said Governors to the said United Benefice pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act and (iv) certain money payments in lieu of tithes charged upon certain lands in the Parish of Gate Helmsley in the County of York under an Act of the 9th Year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Session 2, Chapter 54 and amounting to £9 7s. 5d. per annum and also certain other money payments in lieu of tithes charged upon certain lands in the Parishes of Warthill and Holtby in the said County under an Act of the 29th Year of His late Majesty King George the Second, Chapter 54, and amounting to £12 10s. 9d. per annum and £6 18s. 7d. per annum respectively, all of which money payments are now vested, subject to Section 30 of the Tithe Act, 1936, in the said Governors and held by them in trust for the said United Benefice and (v) the sum of £181 7s. 6d. London Midland and Scottish Railway £5 per cent. Redeemable Preference Stock (1955) now held by the said Governors on behalf of the said United Benefice and (vi) a stipend or annual payment of £67 charged upon our Common Fund and now payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice and (vii) the following several sums of stock now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, on behalf of the said United Benefice that is to say, the sums of £107 10s. 5d. London County £3 per cent. Stock, £828 London Midland and Scottish Railway £5 per cent. Redeemable Preference Stock (1955), £979 10s. 5d. Western Australia Government £4 per cent. Inscribed Stock (1943-62), £1,069 14s. 4d. India £3½ per cent. Stock, £593 15s. £4 per cent. Funding Stock (1960-90) and £1,093 £3½ per cent. Conversion Stock.

" 6. That upon the said unions taking effect provision shall be made by each of the Incumbents of the United Benefices for obtaining such clerical or lay assistance as the Archbishop of York shall from time to time direct and a portion of the endowment of each United Benefice namely, (a) in the case of the said United Benefice of Sandhutton with Gate and
