

Upper Helmsley, a sum of £2,500 £3 per cent. Local Loans Stock now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, on behalf of the said United Benefice of Gate and Upper Helmsley with Holtby and Warthill and being part of the sums of Stock mentioned in Clause 5 of this Scheme and (b) in the case of the said United Benefice of Stockton on the Forest with Holtby and Warthill, an annual payment of £67 now made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Gate and Upper Helmsley with Holtby and Warthill and also a sum of £228 11s. 5d. £3½ per cent. Conversion Stock now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, on behalf of the said United Benefice of Gate and Upper Helmsley with Holtby and Warthill shall be appropriated in each case as a fund to meet the expenses of providing such clerical or lay assistance; and the dividends in respect of the said sums of Stock and the said annual payment of £67 shall be paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same to the purposes aforesaid.

"7. That after the union of the said Benefices of Sandhutton and Gate Helmsley with Upper Helmsley has taken effect the patronage of or right of presentation to the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the present Patron of the said Benefice of Sandhutton.

"8. That after the union of the said Benefices of Stockton on the Forest and Holtby with Warthill has taken effect the patronage of or right of presentation to the United Benefices shall be exercised by the said Lord Chancellor on behalf of Your Majesty and the Archbishop of York alternately, the Lord Chancellor having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Archbishop of York having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of York has been duly given in the

manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Supplementary Scheme bearing date the 20th day of July, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Supplementary Scheme, under the 11th Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, for making certain alterations in the provisions of the Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 4th day of November, 1938, and published in the London Gazette on the 8th day of the same month (hereinafter called the original Order) for effecting the union of the Benefice of Tatham and the Benefice of Tatham Fells, both in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn:

"Whereas by the original Order it was directed, inter alia, that upon the union of the said Benefices taking effect the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Tatham Fells and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith (all of which premises are hereinafter referred to as the Parsonage House at Tatham Fells) should, so soon as conveniently might be, be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for a nominal sum to the intent that such house and grounds should be secured for the purposes of a Church House for the United Benefice:

"And whereas the said union took effect upon the day of the publication of the original Order in the London Gazette and the Reverend Arthur Senior Roberts became the first and is now the Incumbent of the United Benefice:

"And whereas the Parsonage House at Tatham Fells is now vested in us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by virtue of the provisions of the 22nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:
