### Stockton on the Forest Parish Council News

- 1. The recent resurfacing of the road and associated works in the village has made a great improvement to the appearance of the village. We have a number of ongoing road discussions that may have some impact on the village. This is more long term however.
- 2. Duelling Improvements to the A64. This is at an early stage but is hoped that plans will be up for public discussion sometime next year assuming funding is allocated to the improvements. This then will impact the other on-going road discussions.
- 3. Footpaths we are still waiting for the signs to be supplied and fitted.
- 4. The new play area equipment has bedded in now, we hope you like it. The area is inspected regularly by parish councillors and is annually checked by ROSPA who produce a report. Any equipment that needs repair or is of concern is repaired. Please take a look and let us know what you think.
- 5. A new bus shelter has been fitted opposite the school/ next to the Fox as the previous one was badly damaged. This was jointly funded by City of York Council and Coastliner Bus Service
- Ward funding again I will mention it. If any organisations or groups interested in applying for a grant details can be found on www.york.gov.uk and search 'ward funding'

If you have any questions relating to the village/parish you can speak with a parish councillor or the parish clerk. Parish Council meetings are held on the last Wednesday of the month in the village hall, all are welcome. # 🖉 Dean's Garden Centre 🌋



This December will see the celebration of 50 years since Dean's Garden Centre first opened its doors by Ken and Margaret Dean in 1968.

From its humble beginnings of a greenhouse and prefab building, to the large Garden Centre and Coffee Shop you see today, this family run business has gone from strength to strength. Following Ken and Margaret's retirement in 1993, their three children Richard, Helen and Sarah took over the daily running of the business and still continue to do so today. Between the three Partners, they have eight children, four of whom currently work within the business and they are all proud of being a local family firm with strong roots within the community.

Over the last 50 years, gardening has remained at the heart of the business growing their own range of bedding plants, herbaceous perennials, vegetable plants, cyclamen and bowls of bulbs at their nursery site nearby.

The Garden Centre has supported many charities over the years, and since 2002 a charity of the year has been nominated annually and this alone has raised **over £265,000** to date. For 2018 their chosen charity is **Macmillan Cancer Support** and up to the end of September they have raised **£9,286.44**.

#### Stockton Hall Fitness Challenge

Priory colleagues from a range of different locations and sites including Stockton Hall Hospital have been taking part in the Virgin Pulse Global Challenge.

Starting at the end of May, the challenge lasted 100 days and involved teams of seven people aiming to increase their daily steps (tracking using the Pulse step counter or their own device). The goal was to encourage people to change their exercise habits for life.

Stockton Hall had six teams taking part one of whom, the Stockton Superstars managing to achieve an impressive 6,774 miles of activity over the period. The challenge is now over but Stockton Hall staff are still continuing their exercise routines including taking walks around the village at lunch breaks.

On Friday 20th July 12 people from across Stockton Hall Hospital took part in a cycle ride from York to Bridlington - a distance of 60 miles and a real challenge for some of us!

Back in the Spring of 2011 my Son was attending Beavers in Stockton on the Forest and thoroughly enjoying it. One evening he brought back a letter from the Cub Leader who was looking for help to run her pack evenings and I offered my services. On my first night I just stood at the back and I thanked my lucky stars that I wasn't in charge! On my second night I ran through some construction site safety activities and let the Cubs dress up in high vis-vests. They sat quietly and listened to every word I said, and by the end I was beginning to understand the tremendous value of Scouting. By the end of term I had my own uniform, necker and woggle and was in the unenviable position of being the Cub Scout Leader.

In the beginning there were only 5 Cubs but a recruitment drive worked very well and we have run the pack with 12 to 18 members ever since. Looking back at my records I have had 75 children (mostly boys but some girls) coming through Cubs in the past 7 years.


Here is a small sample of the Scouting activities we've undertaken in our little Hut: We have filled the Hut with bicycles for Cycle maintenance; made bird and bat boxes that we gave to the Parish Council; made mini explosions and foul smells for our Science badges; learnt how to map read and how to tie lots and lots of knots; welcomed our local Vicar to discuss faith issues. Away from the Hut we have visited the York Minster Stonemasons Yard and followed the York Cat Walk through the City; walked along the River Ouse looking at the flood defences and taken Bellboats and Kayaks on the same river; visited the York Mosque where we learnt about the Muslim faith; attended nature days at the Castle Howard Arboretum.

Needless to say camping outdoors plays a very important part in Scouting and for some Cubs it is their first experience of sleeping under canvas away from their parents. Over the years we have camped at Pateley Bridge, Richmond, Harrogate, Elvington, but we are also lucky to have Snowball Plantation at the end of the village where we have spent many many nights doing everything from having snowball fights to learning how to light fires, from building shelters to roasting marshmallows, playing games to learning Morse code. As you might expect for camping trips in England we have had everything from sub-zero to blistering hot, not to mention driving rain, but despite this (or because of this) I can truly say that the Cubs have enjoyed every minute of it, always returning home sleepy, smelly, but smiling.

None of this happens by itself and the only reason that we could do so much is with the support from many other Scout Leaders and Parent Helpers, including Kath Shapcott, our Group Leader and Paul Richardson, my loyal assistant.

Scouting is evolving and adapting to keep up with the modern age but will continue to be a unique place for Children to develop, make friends and learn skills for a lifetime. I'm proud to have played a small part in it and wish Ashley, my replacement, all the best.

I'm very confident that she will continue the work we have done over the last 7 years and have many more adventures.



The start of the academic year has provided us with a clear focus on Achievement at Stockton on the Forest Primary School.

The first week back after the long summer break saw our Y6 children attend the annual residential experience. This year we visited Peat Rigg on the outskirts of Pickering. Here the children enjoyed challenging activities such as climbing, zip wiring and abseiling.



For each individual the whole experience provided a range of opportunities which helped them to learn that they could achieve far more than they ever thought possible, particularly when working as part of a team and with the encouragement and support of those around them.

At the end of September we welcomed GIST into school to deliver some Heavy Goods Vehicle safety training to children. The season 2017/18 ended on both a low note and a high note. The team needed to win the last game of the season to stay up but were beaten 9-6 so were relegated.




