Stockton on the Forest Parish Council News

We are a small group of volunteers, living locally who meet monthly to discuss and act upon issues affecting our parish. We have limited finances which are used to service assets such as the play area and in some circumstances issue grants towards things that benefit the community.

So what have we done recently?

The **Play Area** is inspected regularly (a ROSPA requirement) by the Parish Councillors, who check the equipment and clear litter to make the area inviting and safe for children & parents. In May the goal mouth area was fitted with a new astro-turf surface, a great improvement to the usability of the goals.



This year we have consulted on quite a large number of **Planning Applications**; from smaller home extensions, to new houses being built, to business expansions. The application for a wind farm at Murton has been withdrawn.

If you want to keep up to date with local planning applications there is an excellent link to the CYC planning site via the village website at **www.stocktonontheforest.org.uk**

We monitor CYC **grass cutting** operation around village and highlight **road deficiencies** (potholes, manhole covers etc). We have highlighted the poor condition of the road surface through the village and excessive speeding of traffic in parts of the

village especially along Hopgrove Lane South. We periodically walk all the **footpaths** in the parish to ensure they are in good repair, signs are clear and vegetation is kept in check. Please pass any comments on to the Parish Council via the clerk.



All the village **salt bins** are full ready for this winter but we will now have to pay to have them refilled so **please don't waste it.**

Yorkshire Marathon; we made suggestions and comments to the organisers regarding improvements and most if not all have been noted and should have been implemented.

Grants have been given to the Scouts to help them repair the hut and to the Church towards the upkeep of the churchyard.



We are hoping to have a **defibrillator** available to the community for emergency use, fitted on the outside of the surgery available 24/7.

People wishing to attend a **Parish Council meeting** are most welcome. Meetings are normally held on the last Wednesday of the month at 7:30pm at The Village Hall. Agendas can be seen on the notice boards around the village and on the parish council pages of the village website, it's also the place to see what's going on, who's doing what and when. The content of the website is built on input from the community. Please use it.

'Greenfingers' meets in the Village Hall at 7.15pm every first Monday in the month (apart from January and August). We enjoy a variety of speakers on every horticultural subject from growing cabbages to caring for exotic orchids, from bee keeping to water gardens. The talks are usually accompanied by brilliant slide shows and often the speaker will bring along a selection of plants as well — I have a flourishing magnolia shrub bought some years ago as a cutting for 50p! In addition, we arrange a couple of group visits in the summer to horticultural centres of interest (we once went as far as Highgrove!)

We also mount a biennial Festival of Gardening, previously in September but next year moving to July, to which all and sundry are invited to create or enjoy displays and competitions and contribute their own vegetable and floral produce. We even offer an activity room for the children which has proved enormously popular.

The annual subscription is £10, and £1 per session attended, although anyone may attend individual talks for a charge of £2. Membership includes a monthly newsletter and your membership card entitles you to 10% discount at various garden centres, including Dean's and Castle Howard Plant Centre. We have a very healthy membership, made up of both experienced and novice gardeners, but most of all friendly and helpful folk.

Our **November** speaker will talk on 'Wildlife in the Garden', followed by our Annual General Meeting in December – very brief! – a quiz night and bring and share buffet. Why not pop along to next month's talk for a taster – you may become hooked.

Creating A Welcome

We have been thinking, at Holy Trinity Church, how our building can be used to best serve the wider community, and also the church family that meets regularly for worship and fellowship. We really want to be able to welcome people in, and to use the space in the best way possible.

At the same time we are looking at restoring the missing pews half way down the nave, whilst also replacing the eclectic furniture that has gathered over the years with something more considered and attractive.

The aim is to create a more beautiful and flexible space into which the church family can welcome everyone.


